Where Did the Trinity Come From?

God, Three Persons in One, was always there, of course. He had no beginning, and has no end. On this Feast of the Most Holy Trinity today, we have the chance to grapple a little with this Mystery.

We could never, ever, on our own, come to an understanding that there were three Persons in one God. Logic and reason could never come to this conclusion. It is only because this understanding of God has been *revealed* to us, that we can recognize God as Three in One.

You will not find the word "Trinity" in the Bible. But in the New Testament, in the Gospels, we find references to Jesus as the *Son of God*. He Himself speaks of God in a most familiar way—as *His Father*. Jesus promises to send the *Holy Spirit of God* upon the apostles, so that they can inflame the world with faith.

Yet all of this wasn't clarified into a doctrine until the 4th century. A noted scholar Tertullian made some progress around 250 A.D. when he first used the words "Trinity" and "Person" to better explain our understanding of God. Still, controversies and heresies about the nature of God abounded, as many other scholars put forward their conflicting explanations on the subject.

The Church Fathers of the 4th century decided to gather and come up with a final, unified, agreed-upon understanding of the nature of God. They came together at the Council of Nicea in 325 A.D. to officially define the relationship of the Son to the Father, as well as the place of the Holy Spirit. They came up with the explanation which we still use today: God is Trinity, Three Persons equal in Divinity, united in love. They devised the formula which we know today as the Nicene Creed. We recite it at every Mass.

We acknowledge this understanding of the inner nature of God each time we begin our prayers with the Sign of the Cross. One of our best known prayers is a reminder of this Mystery: "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit …"

On this special Feast Day today, may we thank the Lord for revealing so much of Himself to us. The knowledge of God that we have already, is actually an installment towards the day that we will come to know Him more perfectly, face-to-face, in the Kingdom of Heaven.

St. Thomas History – In Dec., 1942, Rev. Hewetson informed the Bishop that the large windows at St. Thomas were allowing air and wind to penetrate the building in winter and sought to reduce their size while utilizing asbestos shingles to insulate and decorate the building. He felt "...this plan would be most economical and effective, especially under the present war-time conditions".
