# Those Darn Labels!

Have you ever purchased an item and then had to struggle long and hard to remove the price tag or UPC label? With adhesive worthy of the space shuttle, these labels cling so tightly to the items that sometimes we just give up and leave them there.

Verbal labels are not that different. Without full knowledge and with no right to do so, we sometimes label others as good or bad, pretty or ugly, smart or slow, stylish or old-fashioned. Some labels have great baggage glued to them, and when people are so labeled, they are also burdened with the baggage that is attached. For example, to be labeled bad or immoral or sinful saddles another with a judgment that says: "That's who you are and that's how you'll always be." Such labels don't allow for the possibility of grace or change or growth or Conversely, the labels we often affix to ourselves—good, upright, transformation. exemplary—are also something of a burden, in that we tend to identify with the label, but neglect to make the daily, deliberate effort that might make the label true. Aware of the human condition, Jesus encouraged His disciples to forego the desire to label themselves or others as wheat or weeds, as Jew or gentile, as servant or free, as woman or man. Instead, He called them to work faithfully to welcome the good seed of God's Word so as to be ready to welcome the Kingdom's harvest in God's good time.

Today's Gospel calls for patience and mutual forbearance among those who await the harvest. Jesus' policy of allowing all to grow together until harvest time may upset those aching to be set apart from the rest and rewarded for a job well done and a life well lived. Nevertheless, the fact that both light and dark, good and evil, weeds and wheat are left to grow together might challenge us to a serious self-evaluation. God has given us time to pray, to stand before God and others, and to look at who we are. We may have a UPC label affixed to our foreheads identifying us as Christian, but the underlying truth of who we are may prove otherwise.

Therefore, without looking to those who stand to our right or to our left, let us look only at ourselves and at Jesus. Is our belonging to Him truly evident in our lives? Is our commitment transparent enough so as to be easily detected in what we say and do? Should there be any discrepancies, now is the time to admit them and to listen more attentively, and to heed the Word that Jesus longs to plant within us.
