The Inspiring Words of Mary

As we enter into the month of May, we Catholics naturally think of our Blessed Mother. This seems to be her month, as well as being the month of all mothers, as we anticipate the second Sunday of this month.

Mary and motherhood go naturally together. Mary speaks four times in the Gospels; each time is connected with her role of Mother of the Lord.

One of her occasions of speaking is the beautiful hymn known as the Magnificat ('My soul magnifies the Lord.') In this hymn, Mary reveals what is deepest in her heart. It is a spirit of infinite gratitude for all that God has done for her—and for her people, Israel. She perceives God's plan of salvation unfolding, and gladly takes up the role that God asks her to play in His plan.

May we all breathe in Mary's spirit of faith, and confidence, and assurance that God's plan is for the best. In following her example, we give her the greatest honor. Here below is a version of Luke 1: 46–55, the Magnificat.

And Mary said:

*“My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord,
My spirit rejoices in God my Savior
For He has looked with favor on His lowly servant.*

*From this day all generations will call me blessed:
The Almighty has done great things for me,
And holy is His name.*

*He has mercy on those who fear Him
In every generation.*

*He has shown the strength of His arm;
He has scattered the proud in their conceit.*

*He has cast down the mighty from their thrones,
And has lifted up the lowly.*

*He has filled the hungry with good things,
And the rich He has sent away empty.*

*He has come to the help of His servant Israel,
For He has remembered His promise of mercy,
The promise He made to our fathers,
To Abraham and his children forever.”*

And Mary remained with Elizabeth about three months, and then returned to her home.
